



### Youth Mission Trip to India

The Great Commission is to GO! During Thanksgiving, there was a group of 16 brave members of our Mountain View Conference who ventured across the Atlantic Ocean to serve in India on a short-term mission trip. This group of missionaries chose to sacrifice their Thanksgiving holiday to serve "the least of these."

After traveling 35-40 hours, we got settled into our lodging and got to work immediately. Our members, joining with other missionaries from different parts of the United States and from around the world, were there to help with projects at a boarding school in Madugulapally, India. Each one of us joined a team to serve in medical, dental, electrical, painting, cleaning, cooking, children's ministry and evangelism.

We painted the church, administration building, cafeteria, and both girls and boys dormitories. We also changed the ceiling fans and installed lights in all the buildings. During our stay, over 400 people were served in the dental clinic, and over 300 in the medical clinic.

The dorm mattresses were either non-existent or in such bad shape that they were torn and smelled terrible, so we replaced all of them and bought all new bedding. The children were so excited to receive new sheets and pillows! In addition, every child received a new pair of shoes.

Even more exciting than all of that, we were able to witness the baptism of 45 Indian people who gave their lives to Jesus!

At the end of our stay, we took the group to see something special after all their labors. We took them from southern India to the far north, to the city of Agra, to see the Taj Mahal. Even though it was much colder there at this time of year, we really enjoyed seeing one of the seven wonders of the world.

The group had a wonderful, very blessed time, seeing another culture and serving others. If you have never gone on a mission trip, pray about it and ask God if maybe this is something you should consider doing next time. You won't regret it!
